Tulip Dasystemon is a species tulip, a naturalizer that has star-shaped yellow flowers with white tips. 6" tall. Plant 4-5" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Tulip Couleur Cardinal is scarlet red, flushed plum and is known as one of the best potting tulips for Easter. 12" tall. Plant 6-8" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Tulip Black Parrot is velvety purple black with fringed edges. 20" tall. Plant 6-8" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Tulip Marjoletti is a tall species tulip, a jewel-toned bicolor of pale creamy yellow and deep ruby-red. 16" tall. Plant 4-5" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Narcissus Cheerfulness is a fragrant award winner whose clusters of small, creamy flowers are flecked with yellow. 14-16" tall. Plant 6-8" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Narcissus Obvallaris is also called the Tenby Daffodil. This golden-yellow gem has a flared trumpet and shorter petals. The coast of Wales was blanketed with wild drifts of this beauty in the 1800s. 8" tall. Plant 4-5" deep and 4-5" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Narcissus Felindre is among those known as the "Poet's Narcissus." This fragrant Welsh heirloom has a vivid, disk-shaped cup with a tightly ruffled orange-scarlet edge that blends into golden-chartreuse around a luminous green eye. 14-16" tall. Plant 6-8" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Narcissus Thalia is known as the "Orchid Narcissus" because of the five pendant white flowers on each stem. No home should be without this fragrant beauty. 16-18" tall. Plant 6-8" deep and 6" apart. #_____ @ \$1 each = \$_____

Camassia Quamash is also called the Indian Hyacinth. Its beautiful lavender blue flowers open from the bottom up. This bulb is deer- and rodent-resistant. 15" tall. Plant 5" deep and 5" apart. #_____ @ .50 each = \$_____

Crocus Flavus Yellow Mammoth naturalizes in garden borders and rock gardens, and is also a good forcer. This rich, golden-yellow heirloom creates brilliant sunny tapestries. 5" tall. Plant 5" deep and 4" apart. #_____ @ .50 each = \$_____

Crocus Vernus Grand Maitre is another good naturalizer and, like Yellow Mammoth, is deer resistant. It is a rich sea-lavender-violet with a silvery sheen and paler margins. 5" tall. Plant 5" deep and 4" apart. #_____ @ .50 each = \$_____

Fritillaria Meleagris are also known as Guinea Hen Flowers. This checkered naturalizes has small maroon and white flowers. It prefers cool, moist soil. 8" tall. Plant 5-6" deep and 5-6" apart. #_____ @ .50 each = \$_____
