To our Members,



Saturday, October 22, 2005 at The Historic St. Marys Theatre, St. Marys, Ohio

Dr. George K. Schweitzer, from Knoxville, Tennessee, is a Distinguished Professor at the University of Tennessee and is the holder of three doctoral degrees in history, chemistry, and philosophy. He has lectured to over 200 genealogical and historical societies in the US, Canada, England, and Germany and has authored 19 genealogical guidebooks. Dr. Schweitzer uses historical reenactment to teach genealogy and dresses in period costume to fit the lecture. His genealogical guidebooks and videotapes of his various lectures will also be available for sale at the workshop.

Dr. Schweitzer will present three lectures:

- Rivers to Trails to Roads to Canals to Trains (migration lecture)
- Researching in Burned out Counties
- Civil War Genealogy

This will be an all-day workshop, with registration from 8-9:00 and the opening remarks beginning at 9:00. The final lecture will conclude at 3:00, with a question and answer period to follow. Lunch will be included and exhibitors and county genealogical chapters will be selling publications and products.


There is free parking on the street in front of the theatre or behind the theatre, with access to the theatre from the both street and the rear parking lot. The building is handicap accessible.




1928 photo of a race at New Bremen Speedway




Race Car Driver Geary Bubp Was Seriously Hurt on July 4, 1954 at New Bremen Speedway.

Geary substituted for another driver for New Bremen's first "Sprint Car" event.

His car went out of control on the sixth lap turning over three times before stopping.

He suffered a fracture of three vertebrae in his neck, fracture of this left shoulder and collar bone, right shoulder blade and concussion of the chest. He never fully recovered from this accident.

Geary passed away in 1984. His wife Betty and four children survive.
